**“ Cultivating Compassion: A Roadmap from the Nalanda Tradition
of Indo-Tibetan Buddhism ”**

Sharpa Choeje Rinpoche is a distinguished scholar from Drepung Loseling Monastery, a six-hundred-year-old Tibetan monastic university re-established in India after the Communist invasion of Tibet in 1959. He is also a former monastery abbot and a revered spiritual figure in the Tibetan Buddhist world. Next in line to become the supreme head of the Geluk lineage, one of the four main schools of Tibetan Buddhism, he is called upon frequently to meet with His Holiness the Dalai Lama, provide guidance to younger teachers and abbots, and to preside at official ceremonies, conferences and teachings—all of which make his opportunities to travel abroad infrequent and this event a particularly rare opportunity. Over the years, Rinpoche has taught thousands of students, including visiting professorships at The University of Virginia and at the University of Venice, Italy.

Given the Center's mission to promote human flourishing by developing educational programs, facilitating dialogue, and engaging in research, we are delighted that Rinpoche is able to join us for this lecture on the cultivation of compassion from the perspective of a two-millennia old tradition with deep insight into the science of mind and how contemplative practice can be used to train the mind to achieve greater wellbeing for self and others.
